Saxby Chambliss **Jim Martin**

The partial-birth abortion procedure – used from the fifth month on – involves pulling a living baby feet-first out of the womb, except for the head, puncturing the skull and suctioning out the brain. The great majority of partial-birth abortions are performed on healthy babies of healthy mothers.

- **Saxby Chambliss** voted to ban partial-birth abortion in the United States Senate. (S. 3, roll call #402, 10/21/03)
- **Saxby Chambliss** opposes abortion and supports protection for unborn children.
- **Saxby Chambliss** voted in the United States Senate against using tax dollars to pay for abortion.
- **Jim Martin** voted against banning partial-birth abortion in the Georgia legislature. This would have allowed partial-birth abortion to continue unrestricted. (SB 357, Vote #498, 03/24/97)
- **Jim Martin** supports a policy of abortion on demand, which allows abortion for any reason.
- **Jim Martin** did not answer National Right to Life's question about his position on using tax dollars to pay for abortion.
